CM pushes for maximum gains from union budget allocations

Amaravati, Feb 12: Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu reviewed the allocations made to Andhra Pradesh in the 2026–27 Union Budget and directed officials to prepare proposals for establishing key projects in the state, including the proposed Rare Earth Corridor.

During a meeting with senior officials of various government departments at the camp office on Thursday, the Chief Minister instructed them to prepare comprehensive proposals not only for projects specifically sanctioned to the state but also for those announced at the national level that could be located in Andhra Pradesh.

He emphasized the need to leverage Centrally Sponsored Schemes and integrate various programs to secure additional funding from the Union Government. The Chief Minister noted that in the past, funds under centrally sponsored schemes were not fully utilized, leading to issues related to submission of utilization certificates. He said that if departments effectively spend allocated

funds, they would be eligible to draw additional resources.

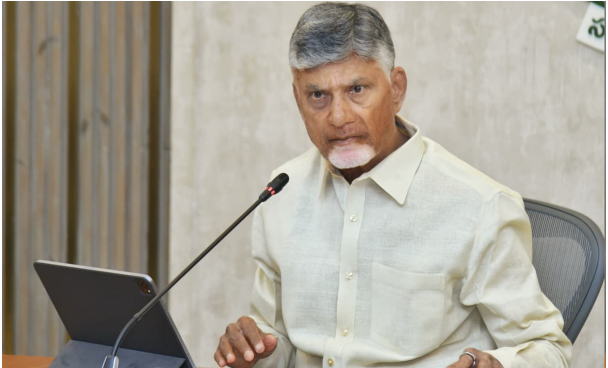
The Chief Minister directed officials to prepare action plans to secure maximum allocations in the upcoming budget cycle. He also suggested making use of the recently introduced “challenge method” by the Centre to mobilize additional funds.

Key Project Proposals

The Chief Minister specified that the Rare Earth Corridor announced by the Centre should be established in the districts of Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, and Visakhapatnam. He also called for proposals to develop value-chain industries related to other valuable minerals.

In the context of the East Coast Industrial Corridor, he instructed officials to submit proposals extending from Mulapeta in the coastal region down to Krishnapatnam. He directed that proposals be prepared at the earliest for container manufacturing and equipment manufacturing projects.

He suggested establishing a Mega Textile Park in the Palnadu region and examining the feasibility of setting up a Sports



Manufacturing Hub in Tirupati. Under the India Semiconductor Mission 2.0, he directed officials to initiate action for setting up semiconductor design and related projects in Amaravati.

The Chief Minister stated that an ecosystem comprising Bio-Design, MedTech Park, and Bio-Pharma Shakti Mission could be developed in the Health City planned in

the capital region. He also proposed developing projects in Amaravati under a “Heal in AP” policy to promote medical tourism.

He directed that electronics components manufacturing be proposed in Hindupur and said Tirupati has significant potential to be developed as a tourism destination.

Focus on Transport and Agriculture

The Chief Minister instructed officials to effectively utilize the 1,000 electric buses sanctioned by the Centre and prepare plans to secure additional e-buses.

He also pointed out that there is considerable scope to secure higher funding for crops such as coconut, cocoa, cashew, and coffee. Furthermore, he said that the state has strong potential to establish food processing projects on a large scale.

The Chief Minister concluded by reiterating the importance of proactive planning and coordination among departments to ensure that Andhra Pradesh secures the maximum possible benefits from the Union Budget.

India Crushes Namibia



New Delhi, Feb 12: (GNS) India secured a convincing win over Namibia in their second league match of the T20 World Cup. Batting first, India posted a massive total of 209 runs for the loss of 9 wickets in 20 overs. Namibia failed to chase down the daunting target and were bowled out for 116 runs.

Ishan Kishan played a sensational knock at the top of the order, scoring 61 runs off just 24 balls. His explosive innings included 5 sixes and 6 fours, giving India a flying start.

After Ishan’s dismissal, Hardik Pandya took charge and continued the aggressive approach. He smashed 52 runs off 28 balls, further strengthening India’s total and ensuring a commanding position in the match.

Rahul Dares Centre: ‘File an FIR, I’ll Fight for Farmers’ Rights and Food Security’

New Delhi, Feb 12 (GNS) Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Thursday launched a sharp attack on the Centre over trade negotiations, declaring he was prepared to face legal action if necessary while opposing any agreement he believes harms farmers’ livelihoods or India’s food security.

In a post on X, Gandhi wrote, “Let there be an FIR filed, let a case be registered, or bring a Privilege Motion — I will fight for the farmers.”

Escalating his criticism that he raised in the Lok Sabha earlier, Gandhi said that any trade deal that undermines rural incomes or weakens the country’s food security framework would amount to an anti-farmer measure.

Taking direct aim at the Narendra Modi-led government, Gandhi added, “We will not allow the anti-farmer Modi government to compromise with the interests of the food



providers.”

Gandhi’s remarks come amid ongoing discussions around India’s bilateral and multilateral trade negotiations, including concerns raised by opposition parties and farmer groups about the potential impact of reduced import duties on agricultural products. Critics have argued that greater market access to foreign agricultural goods could depress domestic prices and hurt small and marginal farmers.

The Congress has repeatedly accused the government of sidelining farmers’ interests in policymaking, citing the now-repealed farm laws that triggered year-long protests in 2020–21.

Gandhi’s challenge — inviting the filing of an FIR or a Privilege Motion — signals a willingness to escalate the confrontation both politically and legally.

The statement is expected to intensify the political debate over trade policy and agricultural protections, particularly as farmer unions continue to voice concerns about price security, minimum support price (MSP) guarantees, and exposure to global competition.



Film Producer Bandla meets CM after Tirumala Padayatra

Amaravati, Feb 12: Film producer Bandla Ganesh met Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu at his Assembly chamber on Thursday.

Bandla Ganesh had earlier vowed to undertake a padayatra (foot march) to Tirumala if Chandrababu Naidu was released from jail and became Chief Minister again. In 2023, the YSRCP government had filed cases against Chandrababu and sent him to jail. Following the 2024 elections, the alliance secured victory, and Chandrababu Naidu assumed office as Chief Minister for the fourth time.

Fulfilling his vow, Bandla Ganesh began his foot march, named “Sankalpa Yatra,” from his residence in Shadnagar on January 19

and reached Tirumala on February 10. The padayatra covered a distance of 535 kilometers over 23 days. Two days ago, he offered prayers at the Tirumala Sri Venkateswara Swamy Temple and fulfilled his vow.

On Thursday, during his meeting with the Chief Minister in Amaravati, Bandla Ganesh presented the sacred prasadam brought from Tirumala. Chief Minister Chandrababu warmly greeted and embraced him.

Bandla Ganesh shared details of his padayatra with the Chief Minister, stating that party workers supported him throughout the journey and walked alongside him. He said their encouragement kept his spirits high and helped him successfully complete the yatra and reach Tirumala.

Sitharaman Defends Fiscal Policy, Says Inflation Tamed and Middle Class Expanding

New Delhi, Feb 12 (GNS) Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Thursday defended in the Rajya Sabha the Centre’s approach to fund allocation and dismissed claims of middle-class suppression, asserting that government finances are managed transparently and responsibly.

Responding to opposition members in Parliament who questioned the release of funds to various states, Sitharaman said, “Centre’s funds are not a free pool of cash. It’s hard earned contribution of every Indian citizen. We refuse to squander the money simply to meet a deadline. There is a very

transparent process and we go by that.”

Addressing concerns about the middle class, the Finance Minister rejected allegations of financial strain or suppression, stating that the segment is in fact expanding.

“The economy is not only for the elite, the middle-class basket is widening. Between 2013-14 and 2024-25, the



number of taxpayers rose from 5.26 crore to 12.13 crore. Thus, within the last 11 years, the number of income-tax payers has more than doubled. Growth has therefore been at a CAGR of 7.9%,” she said.

Calling it the “largest structural expansion of the middle class in the country,” Sitharaman added that a widening tax base reflects voluntary compliance rather than suppression.

“Suppression cannot be claimed when the tax base is widening and the

Nationwide Bharat Bandh Called by Trade Unions and Farmers; Mixed Impact Reported

New Delhi, Feb 12: (GNS) A nationwide Bharat Bandh is underway on February 12, 2026, as central trade unions and farmers’ organisations have initiated a day-long general strike to protest against the central government’s policies, including new labour codes, economic decisions, and proposed trade agreements.

The bandh has been organised by a joint forum of 10 central trade unions, who claim participation by around 30 crore workers across the country. Reports suggest that the strike is being observed in over 600 districts nationwide.

Unions, including INTUC, AITUC, CITU, HMS and others, are protesting what they describe as “anti-worker, anti-farmer, and pro-



corporate policies” of the central government. The Samyukt Kisan Morcha (SKM) has also

extended support, particularly opposing

aspects of the India–US trade deal and labour code changes.

Odisha is reportedly experiencing near-complete shutdown conditions, with markets, transport and government offices affected. In Kerala, bus services and markets have seen significant disruption due to the support of local unions. Assam and parts of West Bengal are also showing strong bandh response, with noticeable participation.

In contrast, states like Telangana and Andhra Pradesh have seen limited impact, with normal life largely continuing. Public transport: Some state-run buses and movement on roads are affected in strike-supporting areas.

Telangana Betrayed, Says Kavitha; Vows Fresh Political Movement

Hyderabad, Feb 12 (GNS) A massive Udyamakartula Aatmagourava Sabha of Telangana activists was held under the banner of Telangana Jagruthi at the historic RTC Kalyana Mandapam in Baghlingampally on Thursday, drawing participation from more than ten activist organisations and a large number of movement veterans and leaders.

Addressing the convention, Telangana Jagruthi president Kalvakuntla Kavitha launched a sharp attack on successive governments, alleging that the biggest betrayal after the formation of Telangana has

Water Breakthrough

After decades of delay, political friction, and inter-state disputes, the long-pending Indrapuri reservoir project on the Sone river appears finally poised to move forward. The resolution of the water-sharing deadlock between Bihar and Jharkhand marks not only an administrative breakthrough but also a defining moment in cooperative federalism and regional water management. At the heart of the issue lay the 1973 Bansagar Agreement, signed by Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, and Madhya Pradesh for the utilization of Sone river waters. Under the agreement, undivided Bihar was allocated 7.75 million acre-feet (MAF) of water. However, the creation of Jharkhand in 2000 complicated the equation, as the newly formed state inherited a significant portion of the river's catchment area. For years, ambiguity over how the original 7.75 MAF allocation should be divided between Bihar and Jharkhand stalled progress on the Indrapuri reservoir project. Bihar maintained that 5 MAF had already been earmarked for the reservoir under the original understanding, leaving only 2.75 MAF to be shared. Jharkhand, on the other hand, argued that since much of the catchment lay within its territory, it was entitled to a larger share — even demanding the entire remaining 2.75 MAF at one point. The impasse persisted despite technical-level discussions, including a Joint Technical Team meeting in Ranchi in 2023 that failed to produce consensus. The matter eventually escalated to the East Zone Council, where, in July 2025, a meeting chaired by Union Home Minister Amit Shah reportedly helped broker a settlement. The new arrangement allocates 5.75 MAF to Bihar and 2 MAF to Jharkhand from the original 7.75 MAF. While neither state secured its maximalist demand, the compromise reflects a pragmatic approach to water governance — one that balances historical entitlements with present-day realities. For Bihar, the implications are significant. The Indrapuri reservoir project promises to expand irrigation across eight districts — Bhojpur, Buxar, Rohtas, Kaimur, Aurangabad, Arwal, Gaya, and Patna. In a state where agriculture remains the backbone of rural livelihoods, enhanced irrigation capacity could transform cropping patterns, stabilize farm incomes, and reduce vulnerability to erratic monsoons. Water infrastructure projects of this scale are not merely engineering endeavors; they are instruments of social and economic change. Improved irrigation can lead to higher agricultural productivity, diversified crops, and greater food security. It can also reduce distress migration and strengthen rural economies. However, several challenges remain. Large reservoir projects inevitably raise environmental and rehabilitation concerns, particularly when submergence areas extend into neighboring states. Transparent impact assessments, fair compensation for affected communities, and sustainable water management practices will be essential to ensure that development does not come at an unacceptable social or ecological cost. The Opposition's walkout in the Assembly following the Minister's statement suggests that political contestation around the project is far from over. Scrutiny is healthy in a democracy, especially for projects involving thousands of crores of public funds — in this case, a budgetary demand of Rs.7,127.35 crore for the Water Resources Department. Yet, the broader picture is clear: resolving a decades-old inter-state dispute through dialogue and institutional mechanisms is a positive development. In an era where water scarcity is intensifying and river disputes frequently turn acrimonious, the Indrapuri breakthrough offers a template for negotiation rather than confrontation. If executed efficiently, transparently, and sustainably, the Indrapuri reservoir project could become a landmark in Bihar's development trajectory — not just as an irrigation scheme, but as a symbol of long-delayed cooperation finally bearing fruit.

District Sets Target to Cover Over 3.5 Lakh Children Under National Deworming Drive

Bhimavaram, Feb 12: A District-Level Coordination Committee meeting was held on Thursday at the Vasishta Conference Hall in the Collectorate under the chairmanship of District Collector Chadalavada Nagarani, in connection with the National Deworming Programme organized by the Medical and Health Department.

Addressing the meeting, the Collector directed health officials to complete all arrangements to distribute Albendazole tablets free of cost to 3,51,125 children across 3,793 educational

institutions in the district on February 17, as part of National Deworming Day. The beneficiaries include children from Anganwadi centers, schools, colleges, and out-of-school children.

She stated that the programme is being implemented by the State Government under the guidance of the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, with the objective of improving children's health and reducing malnutrition. Under this initiative, Albendazole tablets will be administered free of cost to children and

adolescents aged 1 to 19 years.

The Collector directed officials to conduct a special drive to identify and cover children residing in factories, aqua sector areas, and SC/ST colonies to ensure that they receive deworming tablets without fail. She explained that deworming helps prevent anemia, malnutrition, weight loss, and lack of concentration in studies among children.

She instructed that the programme be implemented effectively in all government and private schools and Anganwadi centers. Health

staff, ASHA workers, and teachers should administer the tablets safely after midday meals and create awareness about hygiene and handwashing practices. Parents should also be made aware of the importance of administering deworming tablets to their children.

For children aged one to two years, half a tablet should be dissolved in water before administration, and Anganwadi staff must take special care in this regard. The Collector informed that the tablets will be received on February 17 and administered to children on

February 24.

She further directed that cooking staff in government and private school hostels should also be given Albendazole tablets, irrespective of age. Two days prior to the programme, district and mandal education officials, MPDOs, and Municipal Commissioners should conduct coordination meetings to ensure 100 percent implementation in their respective schools. The date of tablet administration should be recorded in students' diaries so that parents are informed. After the meeting, the Collector unveiled a wall

poster prepared as part of the campaign titled, "Let Us Eliminate Worms for Healthy Children."

Statewide Outreach Meetings Planned to Address Christian Community Issues in Andhra Pradesh

Guntur, Feb 12: Andhra Pradesh State Christian leader Professor Joseph Mosiganti, in a statement issued on Thursday at Chebrolu in Guntur district, announced plans to conduct district-level meetings across the state to ensure communal harmony and address issues faced by Christian students, believers, and the Christian community at the grassroots level.

He stated that in every district capital city of Andhra Pradesh, morning meetings will be organized by bringing together current and former committee leaders of Mandal Pastors' Fellowships in each district. The purpose of these meetings is to discuss community concerns and bring them to the attention of the government, public representatives, and officials.



After the lunch break, sessions will focus on topics such as permissions for church construction, trust registration procedures, matters related to 12A and 80G certifications, constitutional rights of Christians, and information about government institutions available to them. Discussions will also include political representation opportunities for Christians at mandal, constituency, district, state,

and national levels.

Professor Mosiganti added that guidance will be provided on how even less formally educated pastors can effectively, safely, and easily use technology in their services. Information will also be shared about required documentation if opportunities are provided for honorariums to new pastors. Additionally, awareness will be created about precautions to avoid falling victim to cybercrimes.

He mentioned that certain related documents will be distributed, and free services will be offered to the Christian community in the state.

The initiative will begin on Ash Wednesday, marking the start of Lent, on the 18th of this month at Narasaraopet in Palnadu district. For details about the schedule in each district, individuals can send a "Hello" message via WhatsApp to the phone number 9281506386 to receive further information.

Professor Joseph Mosiganti urged Christian leaders across districts to make use of this opportunity, irrespective of denomination, caste, or political differences, and to prepare pastors under their leadership to work collectively toward the vision of a "Golden Andhra Pradesh."

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been the continued injustice to activists and families of martyrs.

She said that while activists remained outside power structures, she herself suffered within the BRS, unable to secure justice for them, and questioned what tangible justice was delivered even after ten years of absolute power.

Kavitha strongly criticized the present Congress government, calling it a historic misfortune that Telangana is being ruled by a Chief Minister with no emotional or ideological connection to the statehood movement. She questioned the silence of leaders and intellectuals who had once supported the government, asking why they were now ignoring the plight of activists.

Recalling Telangana's long history of resistance and sacrifice, Kavitha said the state born out of blood and struggle has failed to honour its own makers. She alleged that while statues of irrelevant figures are being erected, icons of the Telangana movement such as Gaddar, Biruduraju Ramaraju and Suddala Hanmanthu, continue to be neglected.

Declaring a major political shift, Kavitha announced that a new families.

political party will be launched soon, clarifying that it would be a movement-based platform rather than a conventional party, committed to protecting Telangana's identity, dignity and historical consciousness.

She put forward key demands, including immediate identification and official recognition of Telangana activists, establishment of a statutory welfare board for activists, and 20 per cent reservation for Telangana youth in private-sector jobs. She revealed that Telangana Jagruthi has developed a digital enrolment application for activists and announced health insurance coverage for families of registered activists.

Warning the Congress government ahead of the budget session, Kavitha said any budget that ignores activists would face strong resistance. She also criticised what she described as the erosion of democratic values, citing arrests and cases even for social media expression.

Kavitha asserted that justice, not power, defines dharma, and said Telangana Jagruthi would continue its struggle until dignity and justice are delivered to activists and martyrs' families.

Odisha court sentences man and parents to life imprisonment in dowry death case

Balasore, Feb 12 (GNS) In a landmark judgment, the Additional District and Sessions Court at Soro sentenced a man and his parents to life imprisonment on Thursday for their involvement in a dowry death case dating back to 2012. The court, presided over by Judge Meenakshi Dash, also imposed a fine of Rs. 10,000 on each convict, with an additional eight months of imprisonment in case of default.

The convicted individuals have been identified as Santosh Barik and his parents, Binod Barik and Sanjumani Barik, residents of Simulia village.

According to prosecution records, Santosh married Swapna Barik of Khadgapur village in 2010. After the marriage, Santosh and his parents allegedly subjected Swapna to both physical and mental harassment, repeatedly demanding additional dowry from her family.

Tragically, Swapna later died due to poisoning under suspicious circumstances. Following her death, her father, Gangadhar Barik, filed an FIR at Soro Police Station on June 30, 2012, citing dowry-related harassment.

Police registered a case under Sections 304(B) and 498(A) of the Indian Penal Code, along with Section 4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act, leading to the arrest of the accused trio. After careful examination of 18 witnesses and review of documentary and material evidence, the court delivered its verdict on Thursday, bringing long-awaited justice to Swapna's family.

PIB Media Delegation Explores Eastern Naval Command, Showcasing INS Udaygiri and India’s Indigenous Naval Strength

Visakhapatnam, Feb 12 (PIB) As part of a special media outreach initiative organised by the Press Information Bureau (PIB), a delegation of journalists from Dehradun, Uttarakhand, visited Headquarters Eastern Naval Command Visakhapatnam also known as the Sunrise Command to gain first-hand exposure to India’s maritime security architecture and the operational preparedness of the Indian Navy. The visit to Eastern Fleet (Purvi Beda) Ship was aimed at enhancing public awareness—through the media—of the Navy’s modern capabilities, strategic role, and the steady progress being made in indigenous defence production.

The highlight of the programme was an onboard visit to the advanced stealth frigate INS Udaygiri followed by interactions. Udaygiri indigenously designed by Warship Design Bureau of the Indian Navy and constructed at Mazagon Docks Ships Builders Ltd (MDL) under Project 17A, represents the next generation of multi-role stealth frigates. Designed with state-of-the-art stealth features and reduced radar signature, the warship is capable of operating with enhanced survivability in complex maritime environments while effectively evading enemy detection.

INS Udaygiri is equipped with advanced surveillance and radar systems, surface-to-surface and surface-to-air missile capabilities, anti-submarine warfare platforms, and sophisticated electronic warfare suites. The ship integrates modern navigation and network-centric warfare technologies, enabling seamless coordination with other naval assets during joint and multi-domain operations.

Commanding Officer Captain Vikas Sood welcomed the visiting delegation aboard the ship and interacted with the journalists, providing insights into the operational role of the vessel and the Navy’s mission



readiness.

During the technical briefing, Defence PRO Visakhapatnam Commander Sujit Reddy, along with Lt. Commander Prashant Kumar the Officer of the Day from Udaygiri, explained various aspects of naval operations, the functioning of frontline warships, and the Navy’s role in safeguarding India’s maritime interests.

Principal Warfare Officer also the Executive Officer Commander Ambrish Yadav highlighted that INS Udaygiri stands as a strong testament to India’s growing indigenous shipbuilding capability, reinforcing the Government of India’s vision of ‘Aatmanirbhar Bharat’ in the defence sector. He emphasised that, besides combat readiness, the platform is also designed to undertake Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) operations, search-and-rescue missions, and maritime safety tasks—demonstrating the Navy’s role as a force for security and stability in the Indian Ocean Region.

The journalists were taken through key operational areas of the warship, including

the bridge, Foxle with its weapons deck, Helo Deck with Hangar where Helicopter is stowed at Sea followed by the Boat and Torpedo firing Decks. Naval officers also briefed the delegation on emerging maritime security challenges, India’s strategic responsibilities in the Indian Ocean Region, and the increasing importance of technologically advanced, indigenously built platforms in modern naval warfare.

The visiting media representatives appreciated the professionalism, technological sophistication, and high operational standards maintained by the Indian Navy. They noted that such exposure visits enable accurate and informed reporting on national security, defence preparedness, and indigenous technological advancements.

The media outreach programme served as an important platform to highlight India’s expanding defence self-reliance, strengthening Indian Navys maritime capabilities, and showcased Eastern Naval Commands commitment to safeguarding national interests while contributing to regional peace and stability.

Life Imprisonment Awarded in 2023 Rape Case; Court Imposes Rs.10,000 Fine

Nandyal, Feb 12: In a rape case that occurred in the early hours of September 24, 2023, the accused, Dudekula Dastagiri (23), son of late Hussaini and a resident of Sanjamala village and mandal, was sentenced to life imprisonment along with a fine of Rs.10,000 by the Special Sessions Court.

According to the case details, at around 2:15 a.m., the accused sexually assaulted a mentally challenged woman near Railway Station Road on the outskirts of Kovelakuntla town. The victim was at the Kovelakuntla bus stand when the accused allegedly deceived her by promising to drop her home.

He took her on his motorcycle to a secluded area near the railway station road and forcibly assaulted her before abandoning her in nearby bushes.

Bleeding and injured, the victim managed to walk to a nearby petrol bunk, where locals noticed her condition and arranged for her to be shifted by auto to the Government Hospital in Kovelakuntla. Upon receiving the Medico-Legal Case (MLC) intimation, Sub-Inspector Smt. Shaik Moulani reached the hospital, recorded the victim’s statement, and registered a case at Kovelakuntla Police Station as Crime No. 137/2023 under Section 376IPC.

The investigation was taken up by In-charge Circle Inspector P. Hanumantha Naik, who arrested the accused and filed the charge sheet. During trial proceedings, the accused absconded and failed to appear before the court, leading to the issuance of a Non-Bailable Warrant (NBW). Under the special



supervision of Nandyal District SP Sunil Shoran, IPS, and the leadership of Allagadda Sub-Division DSP K. Pramod, the police team traced and apprehended the accused. The NBW was executed, and he was remanded to judicial custody for trial.

During the court proceedings, CI P. Hanumantha Naik and SI P. Mallikarjuna Reddy ensured timely production of witnesses. Public Prosecutors Smt. Sarala Devi and Smt. Venkata Lakshmi presented arguments before the Special Sessions Court for Trial of Cases Against Women-cum-VII Additional District and Sessions Judge,

Kurnool, presided over by V. Lakshmi Rajyam.

After thorough examination, the court found the accused guilty and sentenced him to rigorous life imprisonment along with a fine of Rs.10,000.

Senior officials commended CI P. Hanumantha Naik, WSI Smt. Shaik Moulani, SI P. Mallikarjuna Reddy, and staff members HC B. Naganna, PC S. Chand Basha, N. Mali, A. Vamsi Krishna, and Court Constable M. Srinivasulu for successfully identifying, arresting, and securing conviction of the accused through strong evidence and diligent investigation.

(From.P/1) net itself is expanding. This is not suppression; people are coming on board voluntarily to pay taxes," she said.

She also noted that the Budget remains mindful of past economic challenges, including periods of double-digit inflation.

Highlighting Budget 2026 announcements, Sitharaman said 16 new schemes have been introduced with allocated funds, while four existing schemes have received additional allocations.

"In earlier times, schemes were announced without allocation. Budget speeches are more than just announcements about schemes and allocations they also set the direction," she said.

The Finance Minister urged states to actively participate in centrally sponsored schemes, many of which will operate in a challenge mode under the PM Gati Shakti framework. "I urge all parties and members of the House to encourage their respective State Governments to participate actively. Any state that comes forward for these mega schemes can stand to benefit," she said.

On inflation, Sitharaman maintained that price stability has been achieved without compromising growth.

"I want to highlight the fact that inflation is at a historic low, even though growth remains high. There is no inflation crisis in India today. Inflation has been tamed and firmly anchored due to stability and the steps taken by the government," she said.

Responding to concerns over unemployment, the Finance Minister said the

labour market is undergoing structural transformation."In 2017-18, the unemployment rate was 5.6%, whereas in 2023-24, it declined to 3.2%. In fact, the unemployment rate has decreased," she stated.

Sitharaman also emphasized support for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), announcing plans to nurture "champion MSMEs."

"For MSMEs, we are creating champion MSMEs, meaning at least the medium-sized ones with potential to grow bigger. We want to support them while equally supporting small, micro, and nano enterprises that have growth potential," she said.

She added that non-food bank credit has grown by 13%, while non-bank financial company (NBFC) credit has increased by 15.5%. A high-level banking committee on Viksit Bharat will conduct a comprehensive review of the banking sector to align it with India's next phase of growth.

On the issue of oil bonds issued during the UPA government, Sitharaman said the current government continues to repay them.

"The oil bonds issue, which was created during UPA times... we are repaying it even now. My grievance with oil bonds is that it was never reported in their Budget. The basic principle of responsible Budget-making is transparency, and we have delivered it, year after year," she said.

The Finance Minister's remarks came amid ongoing debates in Parliament over fiscal management, inflation, unemployment, and Centre-state financial relations.

MP seeks NH status for key Mizoram- Myanmar border roads

Aizawl, Feb 12(GNS) Mizoram’s lone Rajya Sabha member K. Vanlalvena on Thursday pressed the central government to accord national highway status to two strategic border roads along the Mizoram–Myanmar frontier, citing their importance for connectivity, trade, security and regional development.Raising the issue during Zero Hour in the Rajya Sabha, Vanlalvena urged the Centre to declare the Hnaithial-Tarpho-Khawhri-Cherhlun-Thingsai-Bualpui H-Saisihchhuah road and the Hnaithial-Tuipui D-Darzo-S. Vanlaiphai-Sangau-Pangkhuah-Saisihchhuah road as national highways.Both routes provide vital links to Myanmar through Saisihchhuah, a border village in southern Mizoram’s Lawngtlai district.The MP informed the House that on the Myanmar side, the government has already completed construction of a double-lane road from Hakha, the capital of Chin State, up to Saisihchhuah. However, he pointed out that connectivity on the Indian side remains inadequate, undermining the potential of cross-border infrastructure already in place.Vanlalvena noted that the Ministry of Commerce and Industry has declared Saisihchhuah as a border haat, intended to function as a mini border trade centre. Despite this, he said, the lack of proper road connectivity has prevented the border haat from becoming operational and benefiting local communities.

Sarma has filed a defamation case seeking Rs 500 crore against the three Congress leaders for making false, malicious and defamatory allegations against him through a press conference.It may be mentioned here that the three Congress leaders during a press conference on February 4 made a series of corruption allegations against Sarma. The opposition leaders have accused Sarma of holding illegal land assets worth Rs. 12000 crore."It is evident that the petitioner is the Chief Minister of Assam, having high status in the society and his reputation has suffered before the society and he has to suffer mentally due to the impugned defamatory publications by the defendants without any documents," the court observed.

The court order said that the interim order has been passed to restrain the defendants from making any further defamatory statements.

A special fireside conversation featuring environmental leaders Swami Prem Parivartan (Peepal Baba) and Ramveer Tanwar, popularly known as the 'Pond Man of India', will focus on the role of community action and behavioural change in restoring urban

ecosystems.

On the sidelines of the Expo, DDA will formalise strategic partnerships with leading national institutions to strengthen Delhi’s green and cultural ecosystem.

Collaboration with the National Medicinal Plants Board will support the development of herbal gardens, medicinal nurseries and biodiversity conservation across DDA parks.

In partnership with the National School of Drama, DDA will launch ‘RangBaag’, a community theatre initiative for children in park spaces.

A comprehensive collaboration with the University of Delhi will promote urban ecological research and youth engagement, while a partnership with WWF will establish ‘Citizens’ Nature Hubs’ to encourage environmental learning and action.

DDA will also work with Delhi Technological University to enhance research and development in ecology, sustainability and technology-driven urban solutions, with a focus on involving young professionals in planning and implementation.

Additionally, a collaboration with the Mathura-Vrindavan Development Authority (MVDA) will facilitate knowledge-sharing and technical guidance in areas such as urban built environment improvement, public realm enhancement and sustainable material use.

Key sessions at the Expo include

Senior policymakers and development leaders will also participate in a panel on “Designing for Climate-Responsive Cities,” focusing on energy-efficient urban design, climate-adaptive public spaces and resilient infrastructure.

The Expo will further highlight emerging sustainability priorities such as urban food circularity, balancing development with ecological conservation, and scalable green financing models including CSR and public-private partnerships. Innovations in urban greening, water management, waste solutions and climate-resilient design will also be showcased.

With participation from senior government officials, global institutions, academia, industry and civil society, the DDA Green Expo 2026 is expected to emerge as a landmark national forum for advancing climate-responsive urban development in the coun try.

Manipur Witnesses Partial Shutdown due to All India strike

Imphal, Feb 12 (GNS) Manipur witnessed a partial shutdown on Thursday as the state joined the nationwide Bharat Bandh call given by central trade unions and various national federations. The bandh received support from the Co-ordinating Body of Trade Unions, Manipur, resulting in mixed responses across the capital and other areas.

A large portion of Khwairamband Keithel, including the women’s market remained closed during the day. Public transport services were also affected as some transporters supported the strike.

In a statement, the Co-ordinating Body of Trade Unions, Manipur noted that the strike was organised in protest against what it termed as “pro-corporate policies” of the Central Government. The unions alleged that recent economic and labour reforms have weakened workers’ rights, accelerated privatization, and increased economic hardship for workers, farmers and the general public.

The unions strongly criticised the

implementation of the four Labour Codes, claiming they dilute existing labour protections and undermine collective bargaining rights. They also opposed privatization of public sector enterprises and essential services, as well as policies encouraging increased corporate control over key sectors of the economy.

The unions expressed concern over rising unemployment, growing contractualisation of jobs, and the escalating prices of essential commodities, including fuel and LPG. They noted that domestic LPG cylinder prices have crossed Rs. 1,000 in many areas.

Objections were also raised against the proposed Electricity Bill 2025, amendments to the Insurance Act, the National Education Policy, the Seed Bill 2025, and Free Trade Agreements with the United Kingdom, European union and the United States. According to the unions, these measures adversely affect workers, farmers and the broader public.

The statement further highlighted

concerns over privatization initiatives in sectors such as banking, insurance, railways, defence production, coal, steel, telecommunications, ports, airports and other public utilities, alleging that such policies increase inequality while benefiting large corporations.

Among their major demands, the unions called for a legal guarantee of Minimum Support Price (MSP) at C2 plus 50 percent with assured procurement for all crops, loan waivers for farmers, proper implementation of the Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement (LARR) Act, 2013, strengthening of public sector units, protection of workers’ rights and social security, effective measures to control price rise, employment generation, and regularisation of contract workers.

The Co-ordinating Body of Trade Unions, Manipur — comprising AITUC, CITU, INTUC, TUCC, UTUC and SKM–Loumi Lupsing extended full support and actively participated in the All India General Strike .

Liver, kidney transplants soon in Jharkhand

Ranchi, Feb 12(GNS) Jharkhand Health Minister Irfan Ansari on Thursday announced that liver and kidney transplant services will soon be introduced in the state, with a special financial package to be provided to patients undergoing these procedures.

Ansari said the government is working tirelessly to strengthen the state’s healthcare system and expects cooperation from the Opposition.He alleged that efforts were being made to obstruct development in the health sector, to the RIMS-2 project and proposed infrastructure upgrades aimed at improving emergency services, including lift installations. He said these projects are meant for public welfare and not for private benefit.

Ansari described senior physician Majid Alam as a valuable asset to the state and said he personally learned the nuances of surgery under his guidance.

The MS Memorial Super Speciality Hospital (Alam Hospital Unit) was inaugurated in Ranchi to further strengthen advanced healthcare services. The Health Minister said providing quality medical facilities to the people of the state remains his top priority.

The hospital will offer multi-speciality services equipped with advanced technology, including organ transplant facilities, gynecology and obstetrics, plastic surgery, and a high-tech pathology laboratory. It

houses Jharkhand’s first robotic surgery facility, has a capacity of 150 beds, four modular operation theatres, an 8,000 sq ft ICU, and a 20-bed NICU.

Hospital CEO Dr Majid Alam stated that 10 beds will be reserved on a charitable basis for underprivileged patients. The facility will provide services such as bariatric surgery, advanced laparoscopic and hysteroscopic procedures, microscopic and endoscopic spine surgery, advanced urological surgery, interventional radiology, high-risk pregnancy management, and cancer screening and surgeries.Kidney and liver transplant services are also planned to be launched at the hospital in the near future.

BJP fulfils long-pending demand for equal pay for MCD MTS employees: Delhi Mayor

New Delhi, Feb 12 (GNS) Delhi Mayor Raja Iqbal Singh on Thursday announced that the long-pending demand for equal-pay for Multi-Tasking Staff (MTS) employees working in the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has been fulfilled.

Addressing a press conference, the Mayor said that all MTS employees in the MCD will now receive equal pay and a separate budgetary provision has been made for the purpose.

“The Bharatiya Janata Party does what it says. We have fulfilled the promise made to MTS employees. Tomorrow, during the budget session, Leader of the House Pravesh Wahi will formally announce this and officially seal the decision,” Singh said.

He alleged that previous governments had only given assurances to MTS employees, whereas the BJP has implemented its commitment on the ground.

Around 4,000 MTS employees in the MCD are expected to benefit from the decision.

The Mayor said the move reflects the BJP’s commitment and sensitivity towards municipal employees and marks a significant step in ensuring fairness and equality in pay structure.

Leader of the House Pravesh Wahi said that Rs 50 crore has been allocated in the budget to implement equal pay for MTS employees. He added that the decision was taken after detailed discussions with the party leadership, in line with the BJP’s policies and Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya’s philosophy of Antyodaya.

Wahi claimed that earlier governments had created unnecessary obstacles in resolving the issue, which the current leadership has now removed to honour its promise.

Standing Committee Chairperson Satya Sharma said that the BJP ensures implementation of its announcements.

She noted that MTS employees had repeatedly raised concerns about disparities in pay scales under previous administrations.

Sharma said that some MTS employees were earlier receiving different pay scales, leading to inequality. With the new decision, all MTS employees will now receive equal pay, strengthening a sense of fairness and satisfaction among them.

Left, Congress-backed unions hold massive protest at HPSEBL headquarters against Modi Govt.

Shimla, Feb 12 (GNS) On the All India strike call given by Left parties and the Congress-backed trade unions, a massive congregation of electricity employees, engineers and pensioners assembled outside the headquarters of the Himachal Pradesh State Electricity Board Limited (HPSEBL) here on Thursday, protesting against what they termed as "anti-worker" and "crony capitalistic" policies of the Narendra Modi Government.

A complete pen-down and tool-down strike was observed under the banner of the Joint Action Committee (JAC) of HPSEBL Employees, Engineers and Pensioners. The impact of the strike was visible in offices and field operations across the state, although emergency services were exempted. During the lunch break, protest demonstrations were held at 63 locations outside Electricity Board offices statewide.

Memoranda were submitted to the Central Government through local administrations in several districts. Pensioners and electricity consumers also joined the protests in solidarity with organised and unorganised workers participating in the nationwide strike.

The agitation was primarily directed against the proposed Electricity (Amendment) Bill, 2025, which the unions allege seeks to promote privatisation, allow multiple distribution licensees in a single area and grant private players access to the existing government network.

The JAC convenor Hira Lal Verma claimed that the move would eliminate cross-subsidies for middle- and lower-income consumers while leaving the responsibility of supplying power to remote and tribal areas solely with the state utility.

The union leaders warned that privatisation would erode employment opportunities, weaken the financial position of the Board—especially if industrial consumers shift to private firms—and adversely impact service conditions and pension security.

They demanded strengthening of the public utility, fresh recruitment, implementation of the Old Pension Scheme and regularisation of long-serving outsourced workers, cautioning that any move toward privatization would trigger a larger statewide movement.

After impressive performances in Jr World Cup and HIL, Manmeet makes Senior India debut

Rourkela, Feb 12(GNS) Hailing from an army background, it's no surprise that discipline, consistency and hard work have been the core elements of shaping Manmeet Singh's journey ever since his father - who played hockey in the Army team- began to teach him how to play hockey at the age of 11.

At 20, the midfielder has now made his senior debut for India, representing his team against Belgium at the FIH Men's Pro League 2025-26 in Rourkela on Thursday.

The youngster came into the limelight courtesy his performances at the FIH Hockey Men's Junior World Cup 2025 in Tamil Nadu, where he finished as the top scorer for his team, scoring six goals and helping India secure a Bronze medal. His notable performances in the last two editions of the Men's Hero Hockey India League (HIL) also caught the eye, eventually earning him his place in India's 24-member squad for the Rourkela leg of the ongoing FIH Men's Pro League 2025-26.

Reflecting on his maiden senior appearance for the country, Manmeet said, "Knowing that I'm representing India and wearing the blue jersey motivates me. It's a feeling of great pride. It was the same when I played at the Junior World Cup, but the only

difference now is that I have more responsibilities while being part of the senior team. The support from the senior players is always there, which is great for us young players."Having been part of the senior camp ahead of the tournament, the midfielder from Punjab is constantly striving to find ways to improve his game. With an eye for goal and a vision for a killer pass, complimented by his attacking intent, Manmeet credited the learnings from the Junior World Cup and the impact of his coaches at the tournament- PR Sreejesh and Birendra Lakra.

"For me personally, they emphasized on the importance of playing forward as much as possible. As a midfielder, you have to lead the team in many ways, whether it is by assisting goals or remaining strong defensively. The coaches always kept the team motivated, and also shared their experiences to help us tactically. My focus has been on carrying the same learnings with the senior team as well."

Manmeet was part of HIL GC in the recently concluded Men's Hero Hockey India League, playing alongside experienced players like Hardik Singh and Kane Russell. He highlighted the importance of the tournament, not only for the opportunity it provides to rub shoulders with the best

players in the world, but also the platform it offers to help youngsters make their mark.

"It's a great platform for us. Before the HIL, the players coming into the national camp and setup would come straight from the state teams. Now, this tournament gives us an opportunity to showcase ourselves. Everyone is always watching the matches, including the coaches. So, if you play well, you will get called up to the national camp."

Further elaborating on his learnings from the tournament, Manmeet highlighted, "You get to learn from the seniors. You learn how to play under pressure, how to control the ball, and how to do pre-scanning. Even from the foreign players, you can see how they get ready for their matches and how they maintain their mindset."

From doing well in the Junior World Cup last year to now making his senior debut for India, it's been a rapid rise for the 20-year-old. However, Manmeet insists that this is only the first step in fulfilling his lifelong dream of winning a medal for India at the Olympics.

"My mindset is focused on working on my game as much as possible, to improve on areas where there might be some shortcomings and eventually represent India at the Olympics to win a medal. That's the dream", he concluded.

New Delhi, Feb 12(GNS) Delhi Education Minister Ashish Sood on Thursday interacted with over 50 sports influencers, media representatives, Arjuna Awardees, fitness coaches and sports personalities ahead of the launch of 'Delhi Khel Mahakumbh', scheduled to begin on Friday.

Sood said the Mahakumbh will provide a strong platform for women athletes, with special focus on their safety and participation.He added that increased involvement of women in sports would encourage wider participation and create a positive social impact.

The exact cause of the suicide is under investigation.

Local police are examining the circumstances surrounding the incident.

Partial response to industrial strike in West Bengal

Kolkata, Feb 12 (GNS) A nationwide industrial strike called on Thursday by a joint forum of 21 central trade unions evoked a partial response across West Bengal, with work affected in some banks, factories and industrial zones, while normal activities continued in many areas.

The strike was part of a nationwide general strike called by central trade unions, including CITU, AITUC and UTUC, demanding the repeal of the four new labour codes introduced by replacing 29 existing labour laws.

The unions alleged that the new codes were "anti-worker, curtailed labour rights, reduced job security and made hiring and retrenchment" easier for employers.

They also raised concerns over privatisation, wage structures, and lack of social security. In poll-bound West Bengal, the joint forum also launched protests under the slogan "Save Bengal."

In Hooghly district, the strike had a visible impact in the jute sector. Workers of Shyamnagar North Jute Mill at Bhadreswar and Ganges Jute Mill at Bansberia joined the strike, with unions staging demonstrations and picketing outside the mill gates.

Although the gates opened around 6 am, workers did not enter the premises and production remained suspended during the morning shift.In Durgapur, the strike had a mixed impact on the industrial and mining belt. Left-affiliated trade union supporters assembled outside the main gate of the Durgapur Steel Plant, raising slogans and holding banners against the Centre's labour

policies, privatisation, and price rise.

"This strike is extremely significant to protect workers' interests and to oppose the amendments to labour laws. The Centre's policies are curtailing workers' rights, increasing contractual employment and gradually pushing public sector undertakings



reported in different areas.

However, public transport services largely operated normally as unions kept higher secondary examination candidates out of the purview of the strike.

Similar mixed effects were seen in Jalpaiguri, where CITU supporters closed the main post office by putting up red flags and staged demonstrations, while transport services continued partially for examinees.

In Howrah, tensions were reported outside Bally Jute Mill, where multiple trade unions protested against the labour codes, claiming worker attendance was significantly lower than usual.

In contrast, the ruling party-backed INTTUC argued for keeping the mill operational, stating that industrial activity was in workers' interest and disputes should be resolved through dialogue.

Opposing the strike, Trinamool Congress-backed labour leader and core committee member Manas Adhikari said, "Ahead of the 2026 elections, opposition parties are trying to gain political space in the state. Such strikes disrupt industrial production and directly affect the daily earnings of ordinary workers. Normal functioning of factories must be maintained, and workers should join duty."

Meanwhile, the state finance department on Wednesday issued a directive stating that all state government offices would remain open on the strike day and employee attendance would be mandatory.

The state government warned that absence without valid reasons could lead to pay cuts and show-cause notices.

Dropped Chances, Heavy Consequences: Fielding Errors Haunt Teams in T20 World Cup Opener

Mumbai, Feb 12(GNS) : The opening week of the T20 World Cup has already underlined a timeless cricketing truth — catches win matches. For several teams, especially associate nations and emerging sides, costly dropped chances have turned potential victories into heartbreaking defeats.

The Moment That Slipped Away

In Colombo on February 7, during the Netherlands' clash against Pakistan, a single dropped catch altered the course of the game. Dutch pacer Logan van Beek bowled a full toss that Pakistan's Faheem Ashraf miscued toward long-off. As the ball hung in the air, Ashraf later admitted he began praying.

Max O'Dowd ran to his right, settled under the skier and appeared set to complete the catch. But as he took it, his knee brushed the ground, causing the ball to pop out of his hands. Pakistan, at that stage, needed 23 runs off 11 balls with their last recognized batting pair at the crease.

The reprieve proved decisive. The next four deliveries went for six, dot, six, and four, reducing the equation to just five runs in the final over. Pakistan went on to seal the win, while the Dutch were left rueing what could have been.

"Any fan with a brain knows that was the moment that cost us," Dutch pacer Paul van Meekeren later remarked.

Unfortunately, the aftermath extended beyond the field. O'Dowd revealed that his



social media accounts were flooded with abusive messages, many of which crossed acceptable boundaries — a harsh reminder of the pressures modern players face.

A Similar Story in Mumbai

On the same day, but at the Wankhede Stadium in Mumbai, another dropped catch shifted momentum dramatically. USA's Shubham Ranjane failed to hold on to a return catch offered by India captain Suryakumar Yadav in the 10th over. At the time, Suryakumar was on just 15.

The Indian skipper capitalized fully on the lifeline, blasting an unbeaten 84 off 49 balls to power India to 161/9. The total ultimately

proved beyond USA's reach, handing the defending champions a winning start to their campaign.

Ireland's Fielding Woes Deepen

If the Netherlands and USA were undone by one critical mistake each, Ireland endured a far more difficult outing. Across two matches, the Irish side dropped as many as 10 catches, including several in their clash against Sri Lanka in Colombo.

With Sri Lanka at 104/4 after 16 overs, batters Kusal Mendis and Kamindu Mendis accelerated aggressively. In attacking Mark Adair, they offered multiple chances — three clear opportunities in quick succession — but

all were spilled by Irish fielders.

Ireland's struggles continued against Australia, where more chances went begging. One notable miss came in the 18th over when Gareth Delany dropped Marcus Stoinis, allowing Australia to press home their advantage.Harry Tector acknowledged the disappointment but resisted attributing it to a lack of focus. "I think they're isolated incidents. Sometimes it becomes a bit contagious when one gets dropped and the next one follows. It's certainly disappointing, and we can't afford to let it happen," he said.

Spin bowling coach Chris Brown echoed similar sentiments, insisting that such lapses do not reflect the team's usual standards.

The Cost of Missed Opportunities

At the group stage of a global tournament, margins are razor-thin. A single defeat — especially one influenced by a missed catch — could determine whether a team advances to the Super Eight or heads home early.

Fielding standards are expected to improve as the tournament progresses. However, for some teams, the damage may already be done. In a competition where pressure amplifies every mistake, one dropped catch can define an entire campaign.

As the T20 World Cup unfolds, the lesson is clear: in the shortest format of the game, there is little room for error — and sometimes, the difference between glory and regret is a ball that slips through the fingers.

Guntas Kaur Sandhu tied 17th after Round 1 of Women's Amateur Asia-Pacific

Wellington (New Zealand), Feb 12(GNS) India's Guntas Kaur Sandhu carded a one-under 71 at the Royal Wellington Golf Club here on Thursday to emerge as the best Indian at tied 17th position after the opening round of the Women's Amateur Asia-Pacific.

The tournament is hosted by The R&A (Royal & Ancient, Scotland), the world governing body for the rules of golf, in association with the Asia-Pacific Golf Confederation (APGC).

Part of the four-member team sent by the Indian Golf union (IGU), Guntas began on a modest note with a bogey on the first hole before sinking birdies on the third, eighth and 12th holes. But a bogey on the 15th hole pegged her back. She trails the leader Yunseo Yang of South Korea by seven strokes.

Other Indians in fray, Ananyaa Sood (2-over 74; Tied 42nd), Zara Anand (7-over 79; Tied 66th) and Jia Kataria (9-over 81; Tied 75th) had a disappointing first round.

Guntas Kaur Sandhu, ranked 545th in the world, had a remarkable domestic season winning four times on the IGU circuit, namely the Gujarat Ladies & Junior Girls Amateur, Eastern India Ladies & Junior Girls Amateur, Southern India Ladies & Junior Girls Amateur and the Maharashtra Ladies & Junior Girls Amateur Golf Championships.

She finished third in the 2025 IGU All India Ladies & Junior Girls Amateur Championship.

Speaking about her round, Guntas said: "Royal Wellington is a challenging parkland course. I attacked the flags from the start but got mixed results today. I will draw inspiration from some of my good performances on the domestic IGU circuit tomorrow. Looking forward to a memorable outing here."

The winner of World Amateur Asia-Pacific earns invitations to play in three major championships- the AIG Women's Open, the Amundi Evian Championship and The Chevron Championship.

WTT Star Contender 2026: Manush-Diya survive scare to reach mixed doubles quarters



Chennai, Feb 12(GNS) India's top mixed doubles combination of Manush Shah and Diya Chitale kept their nerves in the decider to pack off Korea's Republic's Oh Seunghwan and Kim Seongjin to reach the quarterfinals of the WTT Star Contender Chennai 2026.

WTT Star Contender Chennai 2026 is co-hosted by Ultimate Table Tennis, Sharath Kamal Academy, and Stupa Sports AI with the support of SDAT at the Tamil Nadu Physical Education and Sports University here on Thursday.

The top seeded Indian combination, who recently won the WTT Contender Muscat 2026, were pushed to the brink by the Korean qualifiers as they saved three match points before the home favourites emerged victorious 3-2 (10-12, 11-6, 12-10, 5-11, 12-10) in 42 minutes.

They will now face Indian wild cards Payas Jain and Syndrela Das, who defeated Kazakhstan's Iskender Kharki and Sarvinoz Mirkadirova 11-8, 11-6, 11-7 in their first round clash.

Fourth seeds Harmeet Desai and Yashaswini Ghorpade and the young combination of Ankur Bhattacharjee and Swastika Ghosh also set up an all-Indian quarterfinal.

Desai and Ghorpade defeated Darius Movileanu and Andreea Dragoman of Romania 3-0 (11-8, 11-4, 11-7) while Bhattacharjee and Ghosh beat another Korean combination of Park Gyuhyeon and Kim Nayeong 3-2 (11-9, 3-11, 11-8, 6-11, 11-9).

While the mixed doubles players excelled, it wasn't a good opening day for the hosts in other categories as the top seeded men's doubles combination of Manav Thakkar and Manush Shah went down 3-1 (12-1, 8-11, 11-5, 11-9) against Flavien Coton and Thibault Porey of France.

In the women's singles first round clash, 15-year-old Divyanshi Bhowmick put up a good fight against WTT Feeder Series Vadodara 2026 winner Ryu Hanna of Korea but ended up on the wrong end of a 3-1 (6-11, 11-6, 11-8, 11-5) scoreline.

Officials told to prevent fetal gender determination tests

Eluru, Feb 12 (GNS) District Collector K Vetri Selvi has directed concerned officials to ensure strict implementation of the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PC & PNDT) Act, which prohibits gender determination of the foetus.

A district-level committee meeting on the implementation of the PC & PNDT Act was held in the district collectorate on Thursday, under the chairmanship of the District Collector. Speaking on the occasion, Collector Vetri Selvi emphasized the need to create widespread awareness about the ban on foetal gender determination in the district. She voiced concern over the alarming trend where some families opt for abortion upon learning that the unborn child is a girl.

The Collector described such incidents as deeply distressing and highlighted that both the Central and State governments have

introduced the PC & PNDT Act to prevent such practices.

The Collector said that the district authorities should crackdown on illegal fetal gender determination practices. The district currently has 13 government hospitals and 102 private scanning centres, she said and asked the officials to take strict action to ensure that no centre conducts gender determination of the foetus.

The operations will be conducted under a robust strategy formulated jointly by the Health Department officials and police authorities, using appropriate equipment and standard procedures to ensure effectiveness, the Collector told the officials.

The Collector informed that Eluru district reported a total of 1,499 abortions during the last year and directed the officials to conduct comprehensive investigation into scanning

centres and the trend of prenatal gender determination.

The district administration was directed to provide detailed data on abortions and scanning centre operations by mandal and village, as part of a wider effort to address the alarming gender imbalance in the region.

Collector Vetri Selvi instructed the officials concerned to initiate strict action against scanning centres involved in illegal prenatal gender determination and deceptive operations and ordered filing of criminal cases under the PCPNDT Act (Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques Act) and the rigorous enforcement of the law.

District Medical and Health Officer Dr. P.J. Amrutham, DCHS Dr. B Pal Satish Kumar, District Immunization Officer Dr. U. Shobha, ICDS PD P. Sharda and other officials were among those who attended the meeting.

Mah govt Takes Initiative to Implement a ‘Quantum Technology Mission’

Mumbai, Feb 12 (GNS) State Higher and Technical Education Minister Chandrakant Dada Patil has said that greater emphasis should be placed on developing skilled manpower for leveraging future technologies in line with the National Quantum Mission.

As per the directions of Minister Patil, the Directorate of Technical Education has taken the initiative and submitted a proposal to the state government for building the required human resources, infrastructure, and research capacity in the quantum technology sector, an official release stated on Thursday.

The minister said that under this initiative, a Hub-and-Spoke model is proposed to be implemented through the Directorate of Technical Education, with IISER Pune (I-Hub Quantum Technology Foundation) as the central hub.

Leading institutions such as COEP Technological University, Pune; Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Technological University, Lonere; Veermata Jijabai Technological Institute (VJTI), Mumbai; and VNIT Nagpur are proposed to participate as spokes.

Quantum technology-related subjects will be introduced at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels, quantum simulation laboratories will be established, and special training programs will be conducted for faculty members and students.

In the first phase (2026–2028), approximately rupees 20 crore will be allocated for faculty training, curriculum development, creation of essential infrastructure, establishment of quantum laboratories, and implementation of pilot training programs.

In the second phase, about rupees 300 crore will be invested to promote research projects, Ph.D. and post-doctoral training, patent filing, and industry collaboration. In the third phase, around rupees 200 crore will

be used for commercialization of developed technologies, creation of startups, and promotion of employment generation.

As quantum technology is an emerging and interdisciplinary field, there will be a significant demand for skilled manpower in the future. According to various academic and industry estimates, around 25,000 job opportunities per year are expected to be created in this sector in the coming years. In this context, the state government has set a target of developing more than 50,000 quantum-trained engineers and experts in Maharashtra.

The Central Government has launched the National Quantum Mission (NQM) with the primary objective of making India a global leader in cutting-edge technology domains such as quantum computing, quantum

communication, quantum sensing, and quantum materials.

Fully aligned with this national policy, the state has decided to implement the Maharashtra Quantum Technology Mission. Keeping in mind the requirements of future industries, Minister Patil has appealed for special emphasis on the creation of a competent workforce in the field of quantum technology, along with the development of the necessary infrastructure.

Minister Patil further stated that the Maharashtra Quantum Technology Mission is fully aligned with the long-term vision of "Developed Maharashtra 2047" and will be a significant step toward establishing Maharashtra as a leading state in the country and a globally competitive hub in the field of quantum technology.

Ramakrishna Vivekananda literature worth more than Rs 1 cr sold at KIBF

Kolkata, Feb 12 (GNS) Ramakrishna-Vivekananda Vedanta literature worth more than Rs one crore were sold in the recently concluded 49th edition of Kolkata International Book Fair (KIBF).

The visitors stood in long queues to get a copy of Chabite Sri Ramakrishna Kathamrita painted by Ramananda Bandyopadhyay. The stall introduced a quirky yet profound section titled Ankibuki. This initiative aimed to weave Swami Vivekananda's philosophy into everyday lifestyle products, proving that

ED files chargesheet in Goa land grab, money laundering case

New Delhi, Feb 12 (GNS) The Enforcement Directorate (ED), Panaji Zonal Office, today said it has recently filed a chargesheet (prosecution complaint) in a North Goa court against Mohammed Suhail and others in connection of the Goa land grab and money laundering case.

The chargesheet was filed before the Principal District and Sessions Judge, North Goa, Panaji, which has taken cognisance of the matter.

The ED initiated the PMLA investigation based on a chargesheet filed by the Special Investigation Team (SIT) of the Goa Police.

The ED investigation revealed that Mohammed Suhail, described as a habitual offender allegedly involved in land grabbing cases, hatched a criminal conspiracy to fraudulently transfer the title of a land parcel situated at Anjuna, Bardez, Goa, belonging to the parents of the complainant.

The modus operandi allegedly involved the preparation of forged birth certificates to create a fictitious person, named 'Malwin G. Lobo', and forged death certificates of the rightful owners. These fabricated documents were then used to prepare a false deed of succession and subsequently execute a fraudulent power of attorney in favour of an associate of Mohammed Suhail.

The property was later transferred to Suhail's wife in 2010 and subsequently sold to Shaikh Salim in 2011.

The investigation established that the property was allegedly significantly undervalued to project the proceeds of crime as legitimate. Cash transactions over and above the registered value were allegedly utilised by the accused for personal gain.

Mohammed Suhail was arrested by the ED in 2025.

Further investigation in the matter is ongoing.

Italy Script Historic First T20 World Cup Win with Dominant 10-Wicket Rout of Nepal

Mumbai, Feb 12 (GNS) : Italy registered a landmark moment in their cricketing history, crushing Nepal by 10 wickets to secure their first-ever victory in the men's T20 World Cup. In only their second appearance in the tournament, the Italian side delivered a commanding all-round performance at the Wankhede Stadium on Thursday.

After dismantling Nepal for a modest 123 with disciplined spin bowling, Italy chased down the 124-run target with remarkable ease, finishing the match with 7.2 overs to spare. The emphatic win marked a dramatic turnaround for the debutants, who had suffered a heavy 73-run defeat against Scotland in their tournament opener in Kolkata.

Mosca Brothers Power Italy to Glory
The chase was headlined by an explosive unbeaten opening partnership between brothers Anthony Mosca and Justin Mosca. The duo combined precision and power to leave Nepal's bowlers helpless.

Anthony Mosca played the more aggressive role, blasting 62 not out off just 32 deliveries, an innings studded with six towering sixes and three fours. His younger brother Justin complemented him perfectly with a composed yet attacking 60 not out off 44 balls, striking three sixes and five boundaries.

From the outset, Italy's intent was clear. Anthony launched a six over long-on in the very first over, setting the tone for the chase. Justin followed suit in the third over,



punishing Karan KC with two fours and a six. By the fourth over, the Mosca brothers had hammered another six each off Lalit Rajbanshi as Italy raced to their half-century at a brisk pace.

Nepal's decision to hold back their premier spinner Sandeep Lamichhane during the powerplay proved costly. By the time he was introduced into the attack, Italy had already surged to 58 without loss, effectively taking control of the contest. The Rhinos failed to create even a half-chance as Italy maintained a run rate close to 10 per over, cruising to victory before the 13th over.

Spin Strangles Nepal
Earlier, Italy's spinners laid the foundation for the victory with a clinical bowling display. Ben Manenti (2/9) and Crishan Kalugamage (3/18) spearheaded the attack, exploiting the surface with tight lines and clever variations.

Manenti, delivering disciplined off-spin, returned figures of 4-0-9-2, choking the Nepal batters at one end. Kalugamage, relying on grip and subtle turn, dismantled the middle order, including a sharp dismissal of Dipendra Singh Airee (17) with a deceptive wrong'un that crashed into the off-stump.

Nepal's innings struggled to gain

momentum from the start. O opener Aasif Sheikh was brilliantly stumped by wicketkeeper Gian-Piero Meade off Manenti, while skipper Rohit Paudel briefly counter-attacked with two sixes before being caught near the ropes attempting another big shot.

Aarif Sheikh top-scored with 27, while Karan KC's late cameo of 18 not out off 11 balls added some respectability to the total. However, Nepal's innings ended in a run-out via a direct hit from stand-in skipper Harry Manenti, symbolizing Italy's sharp fielding and overall dominance.

A Statement Performance
Italy's bowlers allowed no freebies and backed their effort with impeccable fielding, not dropping a single catch throughout the innings. Former South African cricketer JJ Smuts contributed with 1/22 in four overs, adding experience and control to the attack.

Despite missing regular captain Wayne Madsen due to a dislocated shoulder, the Italian unit functioned seamlessly under Harry Manenti's leadership. The team displayed remarkable composure and coordination, reflecting the steady growth of Italian cricket on the global stage.

For Nepal, who had pushed England to the brink in their previous outing, the defeat was a major setback. The highly anticipated clash turned into a one-sided affair as Italy outclassed them in every department.

With this historic victory, Italy not only kept their campaign alive but also announced their arrival on the world stage with authority.

Comprehensive Arrangements Directed for Smooth Maha Shivaratri Celebrations Across the District

Vijayawada, Feb 12: District Collector Dr. G. Lakshmisha has instructed officials to make foolproof arrangements across the district to ensure that devotees do not face any inconvenience during the auspicious occasion of Maha Shivaratri and that no untoward incidents occur.

On Thursday, the Collector conducted a video conference from the camp office with Endowments Department officials, Executive Officers (EOs) of various temples, and officials from the Revenue, Police, and other departments. He issued detailed guidelines on the precautionary measures to be taken during the festival.

Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that large numbers of devotees are expected to visit temples across the district, including the renowned Sri Durga Malleswara Swamy Temple. He emphasized the need for systematic planning and effective coordination.

As thousands of devotees are likely to take holy dips in the Krishna River at Durga Ghat, Punnami Ghat, Bhavani Ghat, and the sacred Sangamam, officials were directed to remain on high alert on the 14th and 15th of this month. The Police Department was instructed to maintain continuous surveillance at ghats and queue lines, ensure proper traffic regulation, prioritize devotees' safety, and install adequate barricading to prevent congestion.

Officials of the Vijayawada Municipal Corporation were directed to ensure continuous sanitation at all ghats and provide drinking water and mobile toilet facilities for devotees. The RDOs of Vijayawada,



Nandigama, and Tiruvuru were asked to supervise arrangements at the field level and take steps to prevent stampedes or overcrowding, especially during peak hours at major temples.

The Health Department was instructed to set up medical camps at key ghats and ensure the availability of essential medicines. The Electricity Department was directed to ensure uninterrupted power supply during the festival and take preventive measures to avoid accidents at the ghats.

To enhance safety, the Fisheries Department was instructed to deploy 15 trained swimmers in three shifts at the ghats. In case exhibitions are organized, officials

were told to maintain daily fitness check registers. Preventive measures against fire accidents must be taken, and CCTV cameras and drones should be utilized for surveillance. Control rooms are also to be established.

Special attention should be given to the safety of women devotees, children, and the elderly. The Collector also stressed that Annaprasadam and laddu prasadam should be distributed with the highest quality standards.

Organic Mango Cultivation Brings ‘Double Benefit’ to Farmers and Consumers: NTR District Collector

Vijayawada, Feb 12: NTR District Collector Dr. G. Lakshmisha stated that reducing the use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides in agriculture and adopting organic methods would bring a “double benefit” to both farmers and consumers.

On Thursday, the Collector, along with Tiruvuru RDO K. Madhuri, visited Rangapuram village in Reddigudem mandal and inspected mango orchards at the field level. He interacted with progressive farmers from Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) and inquired about the usage and benefits of fruit covers. The Collector personally covered mango fruits with protective fruit bags during the visit.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Lakshmisha said the government is taking proactive measures for the welfare of mango farmers and advised them to make effective use of horticulture schemes. He explained that using fruit covers helps produce blemish-free mangoes with good color and uniform size. The government is providing 15,000 fruit covers per hectare at a 50 percent subsidy, he said.

Such mangoes fetch better prices in the market, and consumers benefit by receiving high-quality, healthy fruits. The Collector explained that when the fruit is about the size of a lemon, covering it prevents fruit flies and



other pests from attacking it. This significantly reduces pesticide costs for farmers and ensures the production of chemical-residue-free fruits.

He encouraged mango farmers to adopt 100 percent natural farming practices. Farmers expressed gratitude to the district administration for establishing a mango procurement center through coordinated

efforts.

The Collector also mentioned that attention is being given to the issue of poultry-related pests affecting mango farmers, and appropriate measures will be taken with the support of agricultural scientists.

District Horticulture Officer P. Balaji Kumar and other officials participated in the program.

Cong & CPM Unions stall basic services during All India Strike in HP

Shimla, Feb 12 (GNS) Basic services were partially disrupted across Himachal Pradesh on Thursday as unions affiliated with the Congress and the CPI(M), along with other central trade unions and farmers' organisations, observed the All India Strike, impacting electricity and other public utilities in several districts.

Employees, engineers and pensioners of the Himachal Pradesh State Electricity Board Limited (HPSEBL) joined the nationwide protest, leading to reduced functioning in offices and field operations. Engineers under the Himachal Power Engineers Association also stayed away from duty. Rallies were organised in Shimla and other towns, with a march from Panchayat Bhawan through Lower Bazaar to the Deputy Commissioner's office in the state capital. A demonstration was also held at the Electricity Board Headquarters.

Apart from opposing the proposed Electricity (Amendment) Bill 2025, the striking

unions raised wider national issues. Speakers criticised the Centre over the implementation of the four new labour codes, alleging that these dilute workers' rights related to job security, working hours and collective bargaining. They also demanded restoration and strengthening of MGNREGA, claiming recent policy changes had weakened employment guarantees for rural households.

The protesters called for withdrawal of the labour codes, a halt to privatisation and outsourcing in public utilities, regular recruitment against vacant posts and regularisation of contractual workers. They further opposed fixed-term employment and extended working hours. Union leaders claimed significant participation across sectors and warned that if their demands on labour laws, employment guarantees and power sector reforms were not addressed, the agitation would be intensified in the coming weeks.

Mizoram launches MSME excellence project, entrepreneurs' forum to boost local enterprise

Aizawl, Feb 12 (GNS) Seeking to energise Mizoram's growing enterprise ecosystem, Chief Minister Lalduhoma on Thursday launched the Micro & Small Entrepreneurs Excellence Project and unveiled the Mizoram Entrepreneurs Development Forum at the I&PR Conference Hall here.

Faster Building Approvals Announced for MSME Service Enterprises

Vijayawada, Feb 12: District Industries Officer M. Madhu has stated that the State Government has taken key decisions to further strengthen the "Ease of Doing Business" initiative by moving towards "Speed of Doing Business." As part of this effort, building plan approvals for MSME service sector units will now be processed on par with industrial units, and they will also receive similar exemptions.

In a statement issued on Thursday, he explained that this facility will be available to

service sector MSMEs located within the jurisdiction of Urban Development Authorities (UDAs) and Urban Local Bodies (ULBs), provided they are registered on the Udyam portal.

He said the latest decision would benefit MSMEs engaged in activities such as automobile servicing, food processing, healthcare services, logistics, hotels (up to 20 rooms), function halls, laundry and dry-cleaning services, warehousing, and tourism services. The State Government has issued clear instructions to ensure that these benefits

are extended without exception. He further stated that the government is making significant efforts to provide faster approvals for MSMEs, create an investor-friendly environment, and expand industrial growth across the state.

District Industries Officer M. Madhu also mentioned that awareness about these exemptions was provided to industrial representatives during the recent District Industrial Enterprises Promotion Committee (DIEPC) meeting held under the chairmanship of the Honorable District Collector.
